IN DUPONT'S BEHALF.

A MINORITY REPORT ON THE DELAWARE SENATORIAL CONTEST.

Several Legal Points Brought Forward Showing That Watson Acted Illegally.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 17. - Senator Mitchell, of Oregon, chairman of the Committee on Privileges and Elections.

The report begins with an account of the proceedings of the Delaware Legislature on the 9th of last May.

The committee concludes that the whole question of the right of Mr. Dupont to a seat in the Senate as claimed.

1 - It is a well settled rule of the common law that the same person shall not exercise simultaneously two incompatible offices.

2 - Under the American system executive and legislative offices are incompatible and the same person cannot exercise both simultaneously.

3 - There is no express or implied authority in the constitution of the State of Delaware for the simultaneous exercise by the same person of the office of Governor and Senator.

4 - Whether or not the office of State Senator and Speaker of the Senate be incompatible offices.

5 - The theory that Mr. Watson can exercise the office of Governor of the State and Speaker of the Senate.

6 - That Governor Watson's exercise of the office of Senator in the joint assembly was illegal and his vote therein for United States Senator a nullity.

7 - The committee, therefore, announces the declaration that on May 9, 1895, the date on which Mr. Dupont claims to have been elected.

Teaching upon the right of the Delaware Senate to pass upon the qualifications of its own members.

8 - The committee also takes the position that the fact that such election is not certified by the Governor of the State in pursuance of the statute on that subject does not invalidate such election in any respect.
